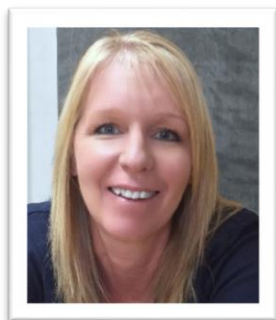

Angela Lindig, Executive Director, Idaho Parents Unlimited

(IPUL) Angela has been with IPUL since 2009 working with families who have children with disabilities and special health care needs. Her firsthand experience brought her to this work 23 years ago when her first daughter was born with a rare genetic condition, atypical Rett Syndrome. Angela and her husband of 26 years are also parents to a 19-year old daughter who was adopted at age three from Romania. She is diagnosed with multiple mental health disorders including Reactive Attachment Disorder as well as Spina Bifida. They also have a 21-year old son who has a diagnosis of ADHD and is in his senior year at the University

of Idaho. Angela is a former Chair of the Idaho State Independent Living Council, and she also spearheaded the effort to create Idaho's first universally accessible playground – the Adventure Island Playground –located in Meridian's Settler's Park. Angela graduated with honors in June 2018 receiving her Bachelor of Science in Human Services (BSHS) with a Concentration in Family and Child Services.



Anne Treimanis, Norwalk CT is an Attorney, Author, Professor, Disability Activist and Educational Surrogate. Her law practice is focused on students with disabilities who have been denied an appropriate education. Anne has experience in IEP and 504 meetings, manifestation determinations, mediation, and due process. Her latest book is “Do Not Tweet at an IEP Meeting.” She is a popular local, state-wide, national, and international presenter and trainer on special education legal rights and disability discrimination. She has presented in India, Poland, Latvia, and the Netherlands. Anne also founded and for 20 years ran the Special Education Network in her local town of New Canaan, which featured monthly speakers and state-wide conferences. She is the winner of several awards

including the CT Coalition for Inclusive Education media award. As an adjunct Professor for the University of St. Joseph, West Hartford, CT, she teaches special education law to graduate students. Anne personally ensured that her eldest of four children, Eva, who has Down syndrome and Type 1 Diabetes, became a proficient reader and was fully and successfully included in her neighborhood high school. She also fostered a young lady with mental health issues after learning that her life-long dream was to wake up in a safe home with a real family on her 18th birthday.
